## Code of Conduct

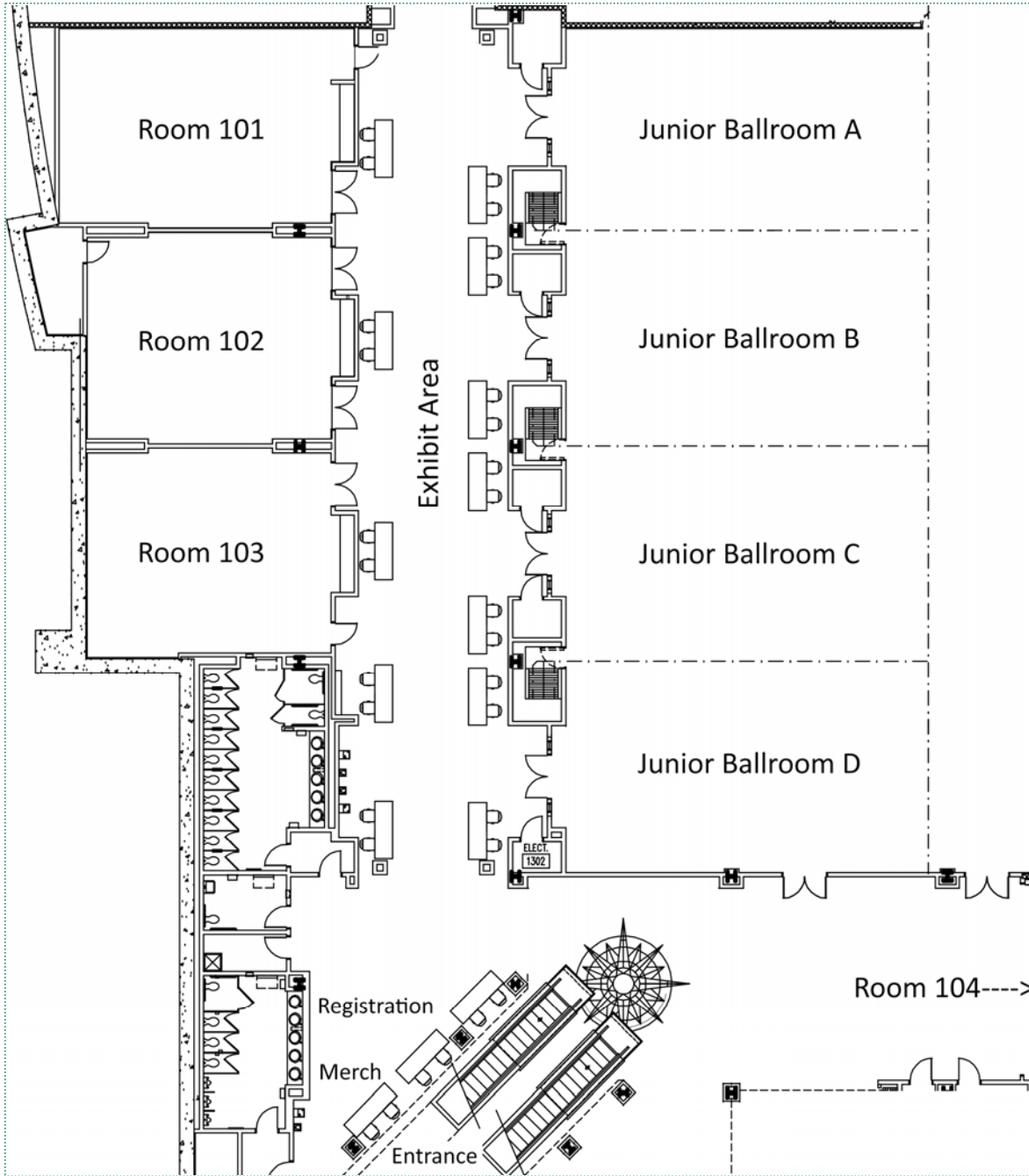
